# Inside Look at Preparing a Mail Out

### Jim and Evelyn Durough Preparing the September 2006 Mail Out

This newsletter is being mailed to 1105 former crewmembers, families and guests. The Association mail out, which is scheduled four times a year, is a sizeable responsibility. Jim Durough co-ordinates this activity. I work closely with him and the other Board Members to gather timely articles in preparation to write the newsletter.

Once the newsletter is completed, Jim and Evelyn put it all together. An average mail out has 4,444 sheets of paper or about 9 packs or reams of paper to fold and stuff into 1110 envelopes. This mail out will have about 8,888 sheets or close to 18 reams of paper. Hand folding the mailing saves about \$50.00. Eliminating stapling saves \$111.00.


Originals of the newsletter, President's letter and all other sheets go to the printer to be copied. Envelopes, stamps and mail labels are purchased. Next, over 1100 labels have to be printed and placed on the envelopes along with the correct postage. Each envelope is stamped by hand, with Bob Carl's return address, to enable the post office to return the envelopes with incorrect addresses.

Finally the mail out is put into each envelope, which is then sealed. The entire mail out is delivered to the post office. Jim estimates the it takes an average of 40 manhours from beginning to end for he and Evelyn to complete the process.

#### Shields Plaques at Mt. Soledad Veterans Memorial

There are two USS Shields DD-596 plaques at the Memorial site. The first being the WWII and Korea plaque, located at wall FF facing west, Row 1 plaque 3. The second being WWII, Korea and Vietnam, located at wall FF facing west, row 4 plaque 10.

If you visit the site in San Diego (La Jolla) the above information should help you find both plaques.

#### Flag Drill for Ensigns



To become a midshipman it is, of course, necessary to take a color perception test. I have always known that my color perception was not the best and was worried lest the test prevent me from becoming a midshipman. I did however pass, and four years later was commissioned.

I reported aboard the Shields in the summer of 1957 while she was in Yokosuka, Japan. I could not wait to get underway and was very pleased, about a week later, to find myself on the bridge as Junior Office of the Deck. It was a warm, clear, afternoon with several officers on the bridge in addition to the Officer of the Deck (OOD). As the Shields was approaching the Commodore's flag ship from several miles away, the OOD turned to me and said: "Mr. Murphy, what is that flag on the Flagship". I wondered why I, rather than the signalman was being asked but responded with an "Aye, Aye, Sir. I'll find out." I raised my binoculars to my eyes, painfully aware that even if I my poor color perception did not prevent identifying the colors, that I did not yet know my signal

I strained but could not identify the flag and decided to guess. "I'm not sure, Sir." I reported to the OOD. I decided to guess. "Is it Alpha?" I asked. "No, Mr. Murphy." the OOD replied somewhat impatiently. By now the signalman, all of whom remained silent, were smiling at my discomfort. "Is it Bravo, I ventured". No. Mr. Murphy." the OOD quickly responded. "That flag you see is the American Flag!" Everyone on the bridge had a good laugh. That day I learned that signal flags fly from the yard arms and only the American Flag flies from the jack staff. I never forgot that. However I never did learn to read signal flags, a skill I thankfully did not need at my general quarters station in main engine control.
